Humanist Conversations

The next Humanist Conversation will be on Friday, Nov. 3 at 7:30 p.m. at the Unitarian Society of New Haven, 700 Hartford Turnpike, Hamden. The topic will be "The American President: An Office and Its Power: The Balance of Power." We will view a video from the PBS series "The American President." Each episode of the series deals with specific presidents. This one, "The Balance of Power," covers Madison, Polk, Taft, and Clinton, and it: "examines presidential leadership in an era of an increasingly divided government. The American presidency was conceived as one part of a larger system of institutions, and its effectiveness rests in part upon a good measure of cooperation among the branches. The presidents arrayed in this episode suggest four different conceptions of governance within a constitutionally structured balancing act."

The video is one hour long. We will order pizza ahead of time (ordering the usual: bacon and extra red sauce; veggies; and one other) so that it will arrive by 7:30. Instead of popcorn, we will have pizza to munch while watching the video. Discussion will follow the video. Coffee and tea will be provided.
