

Democracy Workshop

With all the recent talk about exporting American ideals of democracy to the rest of the world, even down the barrel of a gun, some of us are becoming concerned about the possibility that we could lose our own democracy if we do not pay close attention.

For our regular monthly meeting, Monday, August 16, we are planning to hold a workshop on practical democracy. This event will be loosely based on the ideas of a book entitled "Doing Democracy: The MAP Model for Organizing Social Movements" (the acronym "MAP" conveniently stands for "Movement Action Plan"). In this book the authors divide activist roles into four categories-citizen, rebel, change agent, and reformer—and follow each role through "eight stages of any social movement," from Stage One (Normal Times), to Stage Eight (Continuing the Struggle).

As usual the meeting will open at 7:30 p.m. with an informal half hour of refreshments and conversation, and the workshop will begin at 8:00. We'll distribute handouts based on the book.
