Richard Dawkins, Humanist Hero

Join us Monday, May 16 at 7:00 p.m. at 700 Hartford Turnpike in Hamden when Douglas Peary, vice president of this organization, will introduce us to humanist hero Richard Dawkins.

Richard Dawkins is the holder of the Charles Simonyi Chair of the Public Understanding of Science at Oxford University in England and Vice President of the British Humanist Association. He proudly declares himself a Secular humanist and Atheist.

Dawkins was born in Nairobi, Kenya to British parents in 1941. He studied at Oxford and taught at the University of California before returning to Oxford. He has spent his life studying animals, genes, and genetics and wrote several books including "The Blind Watchmaker," "River Out of Eden," and "A Devil's Chaplain."

Dawkins has said that we must stop respecting religion and submit it to the same scrutiny as any other argument and he has no faith in the absurd. To him the scientific view of the world is true and inspiring, making it exciting. He has said that faith is an evil to be opposed.
