"Ethical Culture, My Religion"— Sunday, May 20, 3:00 p.m.

We take great pleasure in announcing that Ellen McBride of Westport will be the speaker for our 18th anniversary celebration to be held on Sunday, May 20, at 3:00 p.m. at 700 Hartford Turnpike in Hamden. Ellen's topic will be "Ethical Culture, My Religion." An attorney by profession, Ellen is a past president of the American Ethical Union (AEU), which cooperates with many other Ethical and Humanist organizations around the world in the International Humanist and Ethical Union.

In his 1860 essay "Worship" Ralph Waldo Emerson set forth this vision: "There shall be a new church founded on moral science, at first cold and naked, a babe in a manger again, the algebra and mathematics of ethical law, the church of men [sic] to come, without shawms or psaltery, or sackbut; but it will have heaven and earth for its beams and rafters; science for symbol and illustrations; it will fast enough gather beauty, music, picture and poetry."

Inspired in part by Emerson's vision, and like him a supporter of the Free Religious Movement, the much younger Felix Adler
