### The Loch Ness Monster: Anatomy of a Plesiosaur or Anatomy of a Myth?

Join us on Monday, March 17, 2008, at 7:30 p.m. at 700 Hartford Turnpike in Hamden to welcome back one of our very favorite speakers, Dr. Kenneth L. Feder, professor of anthropology at Central Connecticut State University and the author of Frauds, Myths, and Mysteries: Science and Pseudoscience in Archaeology.

A Scottish television news report announced a recent sighting of the world renowned Loch Ness Monster, tracing back eyewitness accounts of a leviathan in the loch to 565 AD. But is that correct? Is there a long history of sightings of what sounds like a plesiosaur in the loch? Or can the sightings be traced back only to the twentieth-century and is there a far more prosaic explanation for the phenomenon of the Loch Ness Monster than one suggesting that there is a remnant population of ancient sea beasts in the loch? You won't need any scuba equipment to investigate its authenticity when Ken Feder applies a skeptical approach to the the story of the Loch Ness Monster.

Bring a friend for this presentation sure to be as entertaining as it is informative on Monday, March 17, 2008, at 700 Hartford Turnpike in Hamden. Coffee and conversation will begin at 7:30 p.m. followed by Ken's lecture at 8:00 p.m.

## Bible Discussion Group

The first meeting of the HAC Bible Reading Group will be on Saturday, March 29, from 2:30 p.m. until 4:30 p.m. at 700 Hartford Turnpike in Hamden.

The book we will be discussing at this first meeting and at our other meetings in the near future is *How to Read the Bible: A Guide to Scripture, Then and Now* by James L. Kugel, based on his extraordinarily popular course at Harvard. Copies of this book are available at public libraries as well as at bookstores and online.

The plan for this group is to go through the book at a reasonable pace over a period of time and to include readings from other sources at each meeting.
