# Book Discussion — The Devil's Disciple

The next book we will read is "The Devil's Disciple" by George Bernard Shaw. Lots of copies of this play and of collections of Shaw's works that include "The Devil's Disciple," are available at public libraries as well as at bookstores and online. We will meet to discuss this book on Saturday, July 19, from 2:30 p.m. until 4:30 p.m. at USNH, 700 Hartford Turnpike in Hamden.

This play, set in the time of the American Revolution in New Hampshire, was Shaw's first major commercial success. Shaw's plays include lots of text that are not in the theatrical productions, making them at least as interesting to read as to watch. After reading the play, you may also want to view the film "The Devil's Disciple" starring Burt Lancaster, Kirk Douglas, and Laurence Olivier.

While the play "The Devil's Disciple" is available as a separate item, it is usually included in collections and it is in most of the collections of plays by George Bernard Shaw. We therefore recommend that you look for a collection of Shaw's plays and then make sure that "The Devil's Disciple" is included.
