Final Exit Network, Inc. (FEN) is an American nonprofit right-to-die group incorporated under Florida law. Final Exit Network was founded in 2004 by former members of the Hemlock Society, including that organization's cofounders Derek Humphry and Dr. Faye Girsh, Ed.D. It was named after Humphry's 1991 book "Final Exit." Mark Davis will be providing information about Final Exit Network's efforts to provide immediate, painless and peaceful relief for screened, suffering members with intractable conditions seeking to end their lives. Mark was a businessman who, throughout his life, found the topics of death and dying to be difficult and uncomfortable. When his mother's health led her to request his assistance in ending her life, it was more than unsettling. His research led him to the book, "Final Exit: The Practicalities of Self-Deliverance and Assisted Suicide for the Dying." After sharing the book's then recommended method for self-deliverance with his mother, she changed her mind, as many do. As aging forced him to confront his own mortality, he resumed his research on issues related to aging, dying and death and became a hospice volunteer in Danbury. Later Mark became a speaker

for Final Exit and he is currently trained to be an Exit Guide. He combines his hospice experience, the principles of Final Exit, personal experience and research into his presentations and discussions.

We will discuss the history of the movement and its future directions. We will try to take to a look at efforts to get the Connecticut legislature to pass a law providing doctorassisted suicide for qualified individuals, and what such a law would and wouldn't provide.
