"Women and Islam"

Attend our regular monthly meeting in November to enjoy "Women and Islam," presented by member Michelle Koth, a music librarian at Yale, who has long been interested in this subject and motivated to do considerable research in the area.

Mickey is not a Muslim. Most of her information comes from a variety of books and Internet sites—pro-Islam, anti-Islam, and neutral—in original English or English translation. She will address a number of key questions: What is the status of women in Islam? Does Islam oppress or liberate women? What do the sacred writings of Islam say about women and their relationship to the religion, men, and the world? How do non-Muslim Westerners view Islam and its treatment of women, compared to how Muslims, both Western and Arab, view the same? She will include such specific topics as equality of the sexes, veiling, marriage and divorce, and inheritance within the over-all context of basic concepts of Islam and its beliefs, practices, and terminology.

The meeting will be held at 7:30 p.m., Monday, November 19, starting with an informal half hour of refreshments and conversation followed by Mickey's talk at 8:00. Plan to attend and join in the stimulating open discussion that is sure to follow!
