On the 11th and 12th of last month members of the Humanist group and the Yale Freethought group we sponsor met with Taslima Nasrin, doctor and author from Bangladesh who has spoken out strongly against the treatment of women in her country. For this her writings have been banned and a bounty of \$10,000 has been placed on her head.

At our next Humanist Conversations meeting at 3:30 p.m. Saturday, December 14, we will discuss women's rights around the world in the context of her visit here, her ideas, and the first volume of her memoirs, *Meyebela: My Bengali Girlhood*, which has just appeared in English translation (it's available at Atticus and the Yale Bookstore).
