## Walter Kaufmann, Humanist Hero

Join us at the Unitarian Society of New Haven, 700 Hartford Turnpike in Hamden, on Monday, February 17 at 7:30 p.m. when Douglas Peary will introduce us to his latest Humanist Hero, Walter Kaufmann. Doug says of Kaufmann, "He wrote some of the finest books I have ever had the privilege to read."

Walter Kaufmann was a professor of philosophy at Princeton. Raised as a Christian in Germany where he was born in 1920, he converted to Judaism on his own at age 12 because he could not believe in the trinity. Imagine his surprise to learn that he was already a Jew and his grandmother had converted to Christianity. In 1938 he came to the United States and attended Williams college where he became a skeptic and unbeliever. He died at the early age of 60 in 1980.

As is our custom, we'll start off with twenty minutes of informal conversation and refreshments at 7:30 p.m. At 7:50 June Schafer will speak briefly on the popular topic "Why I Am a Humanist." Doug Peary's talk will begin promptly at 8:00. Bring a friend and join us this Presidents' Day, Monday, February 17!
