January Book Discussion

The next book we will read is *Moral Politics: How Liberals and Conservatives Think* (or an earlier edition, *Moral Politics: What Conservatives Know that Liberals Don't*) by George Lakoff. This classic book is available from public libraries, bookstores and online.

In July of 2005, we read Lakoff's Don't Think of an Elephant: Know Your Values and Frame the Debate—The Essential Guide for Progressives, which is sometimes described as a short version of Moral Politics. We'd argue that it's more of a teaser of what's inside this longer, more scholarly, better-written and possibly even more accessible book. Do the reading and join us for the real meat of what Lakoff has to say in this follow-up discussion.

We will meet to discuss this book on Saturday, January 12, 2:30 p.m. until 4:30 p.m. at USNH, 700 Hartford Turnpike in Hamden. Refreshments will be served.
