...From the junction of Rt. 64 with Rt. 63: Head west on Rt. 64 less than one mile, passing through one more stoplight. If you pass a gas station you have gone too far. On the right, look for Tzepos Law Firm sign. At that sign, turn right onto Clearview Knoll Road and drive to the top of the hill. Number 57 is the last house on the left. Park in the driveway or on the street.

## Book Discussion — Shaw's "The Devil's Disciple"

The next book we will read is "The Devil's Disciple" by George Bernard Shaw. Lots of copies of this play and of collections of Shaw's works that include "The Devil's Disciple" are available at public libraries as well as at bookstores and online. We will meet to discuss this book on Saturday, July 19, from 2:30 p.m. until 4:30 p.m. at USNH, 700 Hartford Turnpike in Hamden.

This play, set in the time of the American Revolution in New Hampshire, was Shaw's first major commercial success. Shaw's plays include lots of text that are not in the theatrical productions, making them at least as interesting to read as to watch. After reading the play, you may also want to view the film "The Devil's Disciple" starring Burt Lancaster, Kirk Douglas, and Laurence Olivier (see below).

While the play "The Devil's Disciple" is available as a separate item, it is usually included in collections and it is in most of the collections of plays by George Bernard Shaw. We therefore recommend that you look for a collection of Shaw's plays and then make sure that "The Devil's Disciple" is included.

This play is also available free on-line. One source can be found at http://en.wikisource.org. Enter the name of the play in the search box on the left side of the page and press the Go or Search button.
