A Senior Political Analyst with Americans for Informed Democracy (aidemocracy.org), Kogan is also Eskind Fellow in Democracy and Public Policy and a Ph.D. student in International Relations at Brandeis University. Eugene's 2006 M.Sc. in International Relations from the London School of Economics was *with merit* and distinguished in quantitative and qualitative methodology and research design. His research interests include U.S. foreign policy, Congress, international security, and nuclear proliferation in North East Asia.

Book Discussion: "The Jungle"

Join us Sunday, December 14, 3:00 p.m. until 5:00 p.m. at 700 Hartford Turnpike in Hamden, when we meet to discuss "The Jungle" by Upton Sinclair. Both the book and an audio recording read by George Guidall are

available at public libraries as well as bookstores and online.

This classic 1906 novel exposed working and living conditions and corruption in Chicago's meatpacking industry. Although Congress passed laws which led

to the formation of what is now the U.S. Food and Drug Administration a mere six months after publication, the book is really about the mistreatment of people, and not predominantly about animals or food.
