## Is it Time to Rein in the Surveillance State?

Please join us on June 16 at 7:30 p.m. at 700 Hartford Turnpike, Hamden. Our monthly meeting will feature a return visit by Andrew Schneider, Executive Director of both the ACLU of Connecticut and the ACLU Foundation of Connecticut

The National Security
Agency's mass surveillance of
American citizens has greatly expanded in the years since September 11, 2001. Recent disclosures have shown the government is regularly tracking all of the calls of almost every ordinary
American and spying on a vast but unknown number of Americans' international calls, text messages, and emails.

In Connecticut, our privacy is being threatened by law enforcement's use of technologies such as automated license plate readers, cell phone tracking and the proposed use of drones for surveillance. Are these technologies appropriate and if yes, how do we balance our right to privacy?

We'll start with half an hour of coffee and conversation at 7:30 p.m. Andrew's talk will follow brief announcements at 8:00 p.m.

# USNH Cinema, Friday June 6

This month's Humanist Cinema will be held Friday, June 6, at 700 Hartford Turnpike in Hamden. This month's film will be Inequality For All, a passionate argument on behalf of the middle class, featuring Robert Reich demonstrating how the widening income gap has a devastating impact on the American economy.

The potluck starts at 6:30 p.m. followed by the movie promptly at 7:00 p.m. Discussion follows.

### The Demon-Haunted World

The Book Discussion Group will next read and discuss "The Demon-Haunted World: Science as a Candle in the Dark" by Carl Sagan. The discussion will be held on Saturday, July 12 at 700 Hartford Turnpike in Hamden from 2:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m.

How can we make intelligent decisions about our increasingly technology-driven lives if we don't understand the difference between the myths of pseudoscience and the testable hypotheses of science? In one of his last and most celebrated books, Pulitzer Prize-winning author and distinguished astronomer Carl Sagan argues that scientific thinking is critical not only to the pursuit of truth but to the very well-being of our democratic institutions. Casting a wide net through history and culture, Sagan examines and authoritatively debunks such celebrated fallacies of the past as witchcraft, faith healing, demons, and UFOs. And yet, disturbingly, in today's so-called information age, pseudoscience is burgeoning with stories of alien abduction, channeling past lives, and communal hallucinations commanding growing attention and respect. As Sagan demonstrates with lucid eloquence, the siren song of unreason is not just a cultural wrong turn but a dangerous plunge into darkness that threatens our most basic freedoms. The book is available in many public libraries. Refreshments will be served.
