In October of 2018 Marie Pulito introduced us to co-housing and told us about the Rocky Corner project (http://rockycorner.org/) in Bethany. The project was so fascinating that we only got to the first part, explaining co-housing. On Monday, May 18, Marie is going to tell us the rest of the story.

Book Discussion: Zealot: the Life and Times of Jesus of Nazareth, by Resa Aslan

-- May 16, 2:30 p.m.

Sifting through centuries of myth-making, Reza Aslan sheds new light on one of history's most enigmatic figures by examining Jesus through the lens of the tumultuous era in which he lived. Balancing the Jesus of the Gospels against the historical sources, Aslan describes a man full of conviction and passion, yet rife with contradiction. He explores the reasons the early Christian church preferred to promulgate an image of Jesus as a peaceful spiritual teacher rather than a politically conscious revolutionary. And he grapples with the riddle of how Jesus understood himself, the mystery that is at the heart of all subsequent claims about his divinity. -Amazon

Michael Moore presents Planet of the Humans, a documentary that dares to say what no one else will this Earth Day — that we are losing the battle to stop climate change on planet earth because we are following leaders who have taken us down the wrong road — selling out the green movement to wealthy interests and corporate America. This film is the wake-up call to the reality we are afraid to face: that in the midst of a human-caused extinction event, the environmental movement's answer is to push for techno-fixes and band-aids.
